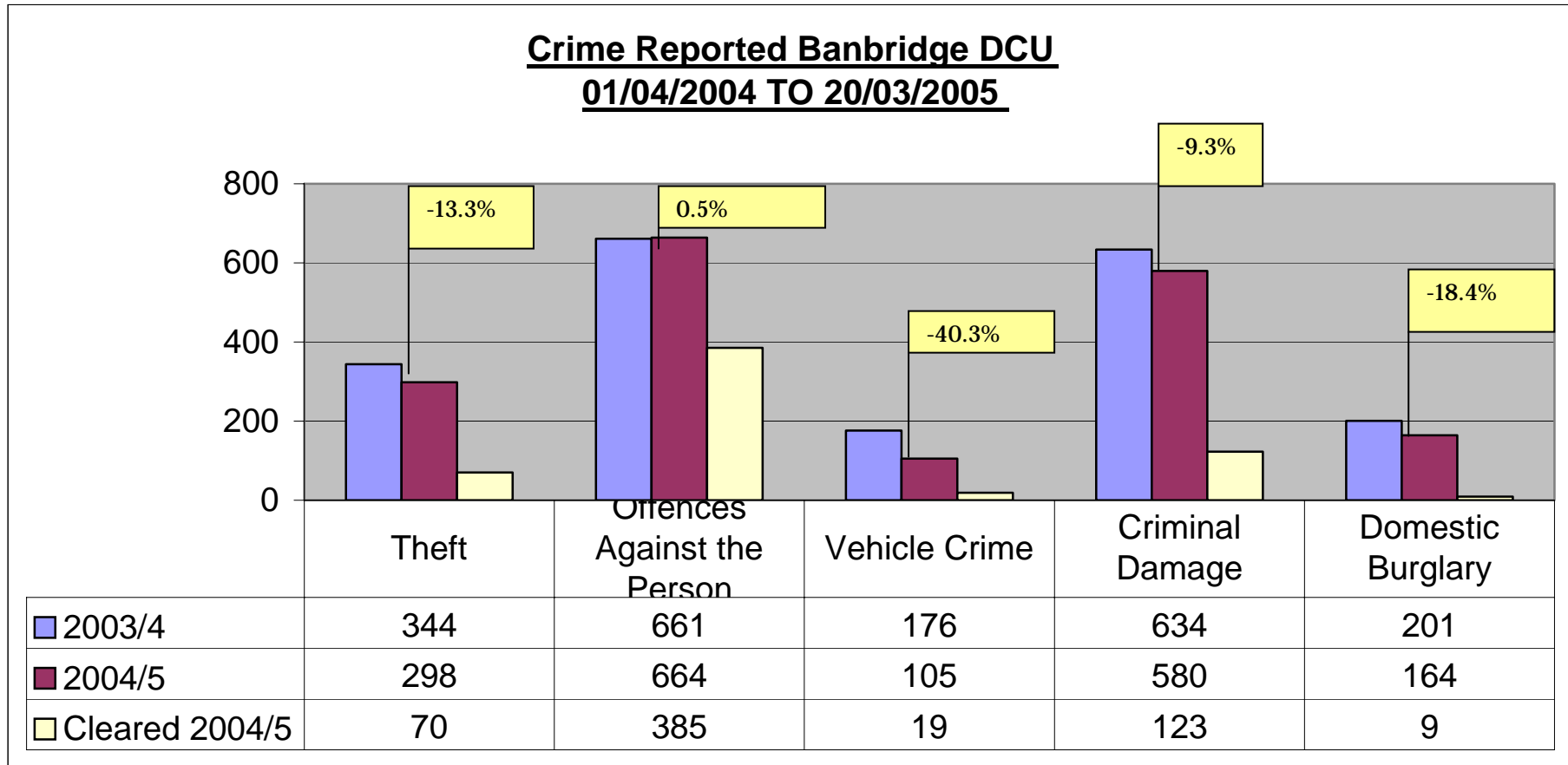

Crime Analysis: Banbridge DCU.

The chart below illustrates the comparison of Reported Crime between 01/04/2003 to 20/03/2004 and 01/04/2004 to 20/03/2005 and number of crimes cleared 2004/5.



Performance Against Local Policing Plan Target

TARGET: Vehicle crime to be reduced by 8%. **PERFORMANCE:** Decrease from 176 to 105. Decrease of 40.3%.

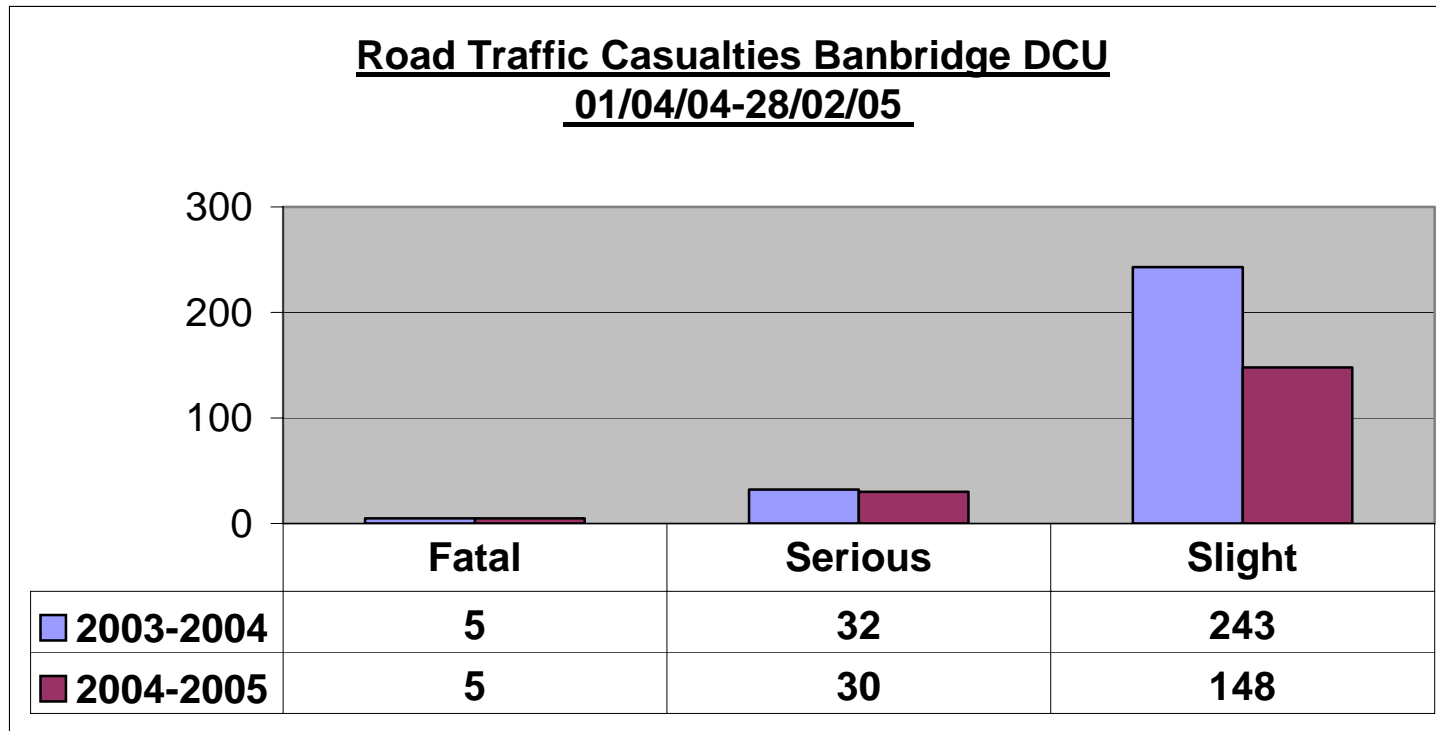
TARGET: To Reduce Domestic Burglary by 4% **PERFORMANCE:** Decrease from 201 to 164. Decrease of 18.4%.

TARGET: To Increase Drug Seizures **PERFORMANCE:** Decrease from 49 to 24. (As at end of February.)

TARGET: Detection Rate Violent Crime Of 55% **PERFORMANCE:** 57.4%.

THE PROBLEM	THE INITIATIVES	THE IMPACT
Community Policing	Increased and focused patrols in: Hillhead, following recent incidents. Chinauley Park /Castlewellan Rd (re. Criminal Damage and Youths Causing Annoyance), Edenderry and Brookfield areas (re. Scooters / Go-Karts)	Targeted, focused beat patrols in February alone by both Full and Part-Time officers amounted to a total of 232 hours. Door to Door enquiries were carried out to enable consultation with the public and offer reassurance, support and assistance where appropriate.

CASE

The topics covered are in the CASE program are:

- An introduction to the police
- Crime and its consequences
- Stranger Danger
- Volatile substance abuse, delivered in partnership with the charity Re-Solv.

At present, 50 lessons have been implemented to year 4 and year 8 students. The Volatile substance abuse section is an extremely popular scheme supported by students and teachers.

Fear of Crime

Personal Attack alarms were purchased through the community safety budget and are continuing to be distributed through various partnerships to vulnerable persons.

662 alarms out of a total of 1400 have been distributed, the most recent audit is as follows:

Burglary

Following an attempted burglary at Loughend Road Loughbrickland on weekend of 21-22/01/05 a leaflet drop was carried out in the immediate areas.

Road Traffic

In total, 4 separate operations were carried out within the DCU requiring a multi-agency approach. This included representatives from Local Police, Customs and Excise, DOE + Road Enforcement, RPU and TSG.

One operation focused mainly on Limousines traveling within the district.

The remainder of the operations covered a wider remit including, Drugs offences, Illegal Fuel and general issues such as Vehicle Defects, Insurance, Tachograph Offences and PSV Offences.

Detections were made for Drug offences, Illegal Fuel, PSV Offences, Tachograph Offences, Insurance, Tax and Driving License offences.

With regards to limousines, 9 were examined and a total of 19 Offences were recorded including No Tax, No Insurance, No PSV Vehicle License, No PSV Driving License.
